PONIES (UK) SUMMER SHOWING CHAMPIONSHIPS.

This show is a qualifier for the Ponies (UK) 2010 Summer Championship Show, to be held on 11th – 14th August 2010 at The Newark & Notts. Showground, Newark, NG24 2NY

1st 2nd and 3rd placed horses/ponies (qualification will pass no lower than 3rd) in all summer national championships will qualify for the 2010 P(UK) summer national championships. Results will be submitted to the P(UK) office within 14 days by the show secretary. Qualification cards will not be presented in the ring. Competitors in qualifying positions, who are **not** current members of P(UK) are allowed **14 days** in which to become members and register their horses/ponies in order for the qualification to remain valid.

NORTHERN COUNTIES PONY ASSOCIATION

This show is a qualifier for the N.C.P.A. Pony of the Year Show and the Part Bred Welsh Ridden Championships to be held in conjunction with the Pony of the Year at **Warren Farm EC, Formby, L37 8DJ** in Sept. 2010. First and Second prizewinners in appropriate classes will qualify and highest not qualified in the first six for Part Bred Welsh in appropriate classes.

THE NATIONAL PONY SOCIETY

NPS Mountain & Moorland Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective M & M stud books. Part breeds are not eligible.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non members but only ponies owned by adult NPS members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 4-6th August 2010.

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place. Judges and/or stewards are requested to check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes and cards. NPS Adult/standard members will be required to upgrade to Adult/Showing to enter the final.

NPS/Area 25 Home Produced Ridden Championship – Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rule book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS S Summer Championship Show.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championship

To be judged under the rules of the NPS. NPS silver medal rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the reserve champion provided they have the required membership card. If the champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the silver medal rosette but the qualification card goes to the reserve champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The silver medal rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first reserve.

Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the silver medal rosette championship to be held at the NPS summer championship show 4-6th August 2010.

BRITISH SHOW PONY SOCIETY

This Show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society ("B.S.P.S.") and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in B.S.P.S. classes, whether or not members of the B.S.P.S. are subject to the Rules of the B.S.P.S., including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the B.S.P.S.

This show is a qualifier for the 2010 B.S.P.S. Championships Show, to be held at Arena UK. The 1st and 2nd prize-winners only in the following classes 79-80, 82-84, 86-89, 91-93, 95, 96-98 and the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize-winners in class 94. The 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th prizewinners in classes 81 and 90 will qualify for the B.S.P.S. Championships Show, provided the animal is registered in accordance to Rule 23 and 28 and ridden by a B.S.P.S.member.

This show is a qualifier for the BSPS Classic Security (UK) Ltd Challenge, the highest placed pony in the Lead Rein, First Ridden, Open Show Pony, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Open Show Hunter Pony, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, Open Working Hunter Pony, that has not already qualified for the BSPS 2009 Horse of the Year Show in the appropriate class, will qualify. If the highest placed pony has already qualified for the BSPS Challenge, the qualification will be awarded to the next eligible pony.

This show is a qualifier for the "BSPS Premier League", the 1st, 2nd, 3rd & 4th placed ponies in the Lead Rein and First Ridden 128cms, 138cms, and 148cm. Show Pony; Lead Rein of Hunter Type, 122cms 133cms, 143cms, & 153cms. Show Hunter Pony, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, 133cms, 143cms, & 153cms. Working Hunter Pony, Show Hunter & Working Hunter classes. This show is a qualifier for the BSPS Champion of Champions, the Champion Mini Show Pony, the Champion Mini WHP, the Champion

Open Show Pony, the Champion Open WHP and the Champion Open SHP will qualify.

This show is a qualifier for the BSPS Black Country Saddles Best Rider of the Year. NFU Mutual Irish Draught Youngstock Challenge. The two highest placed Pure Breds from each age group, Yearling (filly, colt or gelding) from class 17 and 2 yr old (filly, colt or gelding) and 3 yr old (filly or gelding) from class 18 identified on the Grade 1 Irish Draught Horse Register (i.e. out of a Grade 1 mare (either RID, AID or SID) and by an RID Sire, also 2 and 3 yr old fillies already graded (RID/AID), or, if one or both have already qualified, the next in line in each age group, will qualify for the final at the IDHS(GB) Annual Breed Show (date and venue to be announced annually). In the final there will be 3 classes each awarding £150 to the 1st placed semi-finalist and £100 to the 2nd placed semi-finalist. The two semi-finalists from each class going forward to the championship, where the champion will receive £150, the reserve champion will receive £100

This show is a Qualifier for the **Blue Chip & IDHS (GB) £2000 Challenge.** The highest placed horse from class 14, will qualify for the final of the Blue Chip championship, which will be held at the IDHS (GB) Annual Show on (date and venue to be announced annually) **N.B. A horse may only qualify for the final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered.** Each qualifier will receive a rosette and a voucher for £10 from Blue Chip. In the final, the champion will be awarded £1000 prize money plus a trophy and a Blue Chip rug, the reserve champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. Also the highest Pure Bred Irish Draught will be awarded a trophy and £100, the highest placed 15.2hh and under will receive £50.

Class 15 is a qualifier for the **New Snowford G.B. Breeding Championship.** To qualify, the two highest placed Mares must be owned by IDHS (GB) members domiciled in Great Britain, and registered or over stamped Grade 1 (RID, AID or SID) by IDHS (GB) with own foals at foot born in Great Britain and must be by a RID stallion, registered or over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and standing in Great Britain at the time of covering. If one or both have already qualified, the mare(s) next in line will go forward to the final at the I.D.H.S (GB) Annual Breed Show (date and venue to be announced annually). Where the Champion will receive the Snowford Benson Breeding Trophy, a sash, rosette and £100, reserve champion will receive a sash, rosette and £50. Places 3rd to 7th a rosette and £20. All prizewinners will receive a crystal trophy, all other finalists will receive a rosette. In the final the mare and foal will be judged as a pair.

The Darcy Dancer Championship Challenge Trophy presented by Mr. John Bell will be awarded to the Champion Irish Draught. 1st and 2nd from classes 15 – 20 to compete for the championship.

The Championship will be held AFTER class 20.

Classes 32 and 33 are qualifiers for the P(UK) Whittakers Lord Open Hunter of the Year Championship to be held at the P(UK) Summer Championship Show. - 5 The Committee to be elected by all paid up members present at the Annual General Meeting in December of each year.
- 6 Life Members. The Committee can nominate Life Members whenever circumstances so demand.
- 7 The Committee shall have power to elect any sub-committee they deem necessary and any vacancy on the Committee occurring, the Committee shall have the power to fill the same.
- 8 The Committee shall have the entire management of the Show and all matters upon which a question or dispute shall arise or in the conditions attached to any prize shall be referred to the Committee whose decision shall be final and binding on all parties interested Five members of the Committee shall form a quorum.
- 9 The Committee will not be responsible for any accident that may occur and it shall be considered a condition of entry that any competitor or exhibitor shall hold the Show harmless, and it shall be considered to indemnify the Show Committee against any legal proceedings arising from any accident
- 10 The Committee reserve the right to themselves to remove any objectionable or noisy competitor or attendants, and of altering any judging arrangements or event they may consider necessary.
- 11 The Committee will not be held responsible for any losses, mistakes or accidents that may occur in any entry and all entries are received subject to this condition.
- 12 The Committee may add to the number of prizes in any class if they consider that the entries warrant such addition, and withhold prizes in any class where they consider the number of entries insufficient to warrant such a prize.
- 13 All animals except horses, to be on the Showfield before 10 00am on the day of the Show No animal to leave the Showfield before 4 00pm.
