RULES

1. Open to children aged 16 years and under on August 31st, 2010
2. Age will be taken into consideration in every class and should be displayed on the entry
3. Name and school on reverse of entry.
4. All entries to be unaided work of the exhibitor.
5. The rules and regulation printed in the main show schedule also apply.

In each class points will be awarded as follows:

1 st	4 points	£2.00
2 nd	3 points	£1.50
3 rd	2 points	£1.00
4 th	1 point	(no prize money)

The North Yorkshire county Show Junior Cup will be awarded to the exhibitor aged 11 years and under on 31st August, who gains the most points overall in the Junior Schedule. The trophy will be held for one year.

The North Yorkshire County Show Perpetual Challenge Trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor aged 12 – 16 years who gains the most points overall in the Junior Schedule. The trophy will be held for one year.

The North Yorkshire County Show Collage Trophy will be presented to the winning collage entry and held for one year.

The Abbeyfield Children's Exhibition Award, kindly donated by Maxwell's of Northallerton will be presented to the painting entry judged to be the best in show. The Award to be held for one year. After the show the painting will be exhibited at Abbeyfield House, Northallerton for the residents to enjoy.

The Victoria Pattison Trophy will be awarded to the best exhibit in Class J12. The trophy will be held for one year.
