### **HORTICULTURE, CRAFT & PRODUCE /JUNIOR / SMALL LIVESTOCK (FUR & FEATHER)**

#### Rules.

1. A free admission ticket will be given when entries total £4.00 or over. Entries may be in any section of the show. Please enclose an SAE for return.
2. The Committee reserve the right to cancel any class if there are less than three exhibitors at the close of entries.
3. The appointment of the judges shall rest with the committee.
4. Numbered tickets for the items intended for competition will be available in the Marquee on Show Day.
5. All horticultural exhibits must have been grown for at least two months by the exhibitor.
6. The judges will be at liberty to taste all fruit or honey, to cut bread, cakes, pastries, vegetables or break eggs etc.
- 7A. All Fur and Feather exhibits to be penned by 9.30am on the day of the show. Judging 10.00am prompt. At 10.00am all persons except those officially engaged by the Show Committee must leave the marquee to allow the judges to make awards.
- 7B. All Crafts, Produce, Flowers and Flower Arrangement exhibits and all Junior Section exhibits to be staged by 10.00am on the day of the Show. At 10.00am all persons except those officially engaged by the Show Committee must leave the marquee to allow the judges to make awards.
8. After the exhibits are once staged, no one will be allowed to touch, move, or interfere in any way with the exhibits, number cards or prize cards without special permission from the stewards or Secretary.
9. The Committee will take every care of the articles exhibited, but they do not hold themselves responsible for loss or damage.
10. The committee do not hold themselves responsible for any special prize.
11. Any exhibit which has been shown at the North Yorkshire County Show before is likely to be disqualified.

12. At 4.30pm the Exhibition will close and tents will then be cleared of all persons except members of the committee. No exhibit may be removed prior to 4.30pm. without the consent of the Chairperson or Secretary, but should be collected before 6.00pm.

13. Protests. Any protest should be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary not later than 2.00pm on the day of the Show, together with a deposit of £1.00. The deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld, otherwise it will be forfeited

## GIVEN RECIPES

Class 461 - Coffee & Walnut Cake.  
2 x 7ins (18cms) tins.

### Ingredients

3 eggs  
6 ozs (175g) soft margarine  
6 ozs (175g) caster sugar  
6 ozs SR flour  
2 rounded tsp instant coffee granules.  
1.5 tsp baking powder  
2 ozs (50g) chopped walnuts

### Filling / icing.

2 ozs (50g) soft margarine  
6 ozs (175g) icing sugar, sifted.  
1 heap tsp instant coffee dissolved in 1 tablesp hot water.  
1 tablesp milk.  
Few chopped walnuts to finish.

Pre-heat oven to 180C, 350F, Gas 4.

Base line 2 x 7 ins sandwich tins with greaseproof paper.

### Method

1. To make the cake place eggs in bowl and mix in the coffee until dissolved.
2. Add remainder of ingredients and mix thoroughly.
3. Divide evenly between tins, level.
4. Bake for approx 25 mins until well risen and top springs back
5. When lightly pressed with finger.

### Filling -

1. Cream together all ingredients until smooth and use half to fill the cake and place remainder on top.
2. Sprinkle chopped walnuts on top.

### Class 465 - VANILLA FUDGE

Use Buttered shallow tin.

Serves : 1 block.

### Ingredients

1 LB Granulated sugar.  
Qtr pint evaporated milk.  
2 ozs Butter.  
Qtr pint fresh milk.  
Few drops vanilla essence.

### Method

1. Put all ingredients, except vanilla essence into a large heavy pan.
2. Heat gently until the sugar has dissolved.

3. Bring to the boil and boil steadily, stirring from time to time, until a little of the mixture dropped into cold water forms a soft ball when rolled between finger and thumb. (240/115c on a sugar thermometer).
4. Remove from the heat and place the pan on a cool surface.
5. Stir in a few drops of the essence and beat the mixture until it becomes thick and creamy and starts to "grain". At this stage the mixture is thick and still pourable so immediately pour into a buttered, shallow tin and leave to become cold.
6. Cut into squares when set.

## PREMATURE BABY CARDIGAN

You can use 4 ply yarn or double knitting wool.

### Materials

- 1 x100g ball 4ply yarn (double knitting - DK in brackets)
- 3 buttons
- 1 pr size 12 (10) knitting needles
- 1 pr size 10 (8) knitting needles.
- Sewing needle.

### BACK

Using size 12 (10) needles, cast on 40 (32) stitches.

Work 6 (4) rows K1, P1 rib.

Changes to size 10 (8) needles and work in stocking stitch for 48 (38) rows.

Cast off.

### FRONT

Using size 12 (10) needles, cast on 20 (16) stitches.

Work rib as back.

Change to size 10 (8) needles

Work 22 (a8) rows stocking stitch.

Dec at front edge on the next row.

Work 3 rows stocking stitch.

Repeat the last 4 rows to 14 (11) stitches.

Cast Off.

### SLEEVES

Using size 12 (1) needles, cast on 26 (22) stitches.

Work rib as back,

Change needles to size 10 (8) and stocking stitch.

Increase at both ends of 5<sup>th</sup> and every following 4<sup>th</sup> row to 40 (32) sts.

Work to row 32 (24)

Cast off.

### MAKING UP AND FRONT BAND

Join shoulder seams.

Please a shoulder seam to centre of the top of each sleeve. Attach sleeve.  
Join side and sleeve seam in one.  
Mark positions for 3 buttons on front edge.  
Using size 12 (10) needles cast on 7 (5) stitches. Work in K1, P1 rib until the band is long enough to fit all round the front of the cardigan, making buttonholes to correspond with the positions marked for the buttons. Attach band and buttons.
