UKAMHS AMERICAN MINIATURE HORSE OF THE YEAR CHAMPIONSHIP

SPONSORED BY PANDORAS MINIATURE FARM

UKAMHS American Miniature Horse of the Year. This class is a qualifying class for the Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 7-11th October 2026. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

Exhibitors, owners, and handlers must be current members of the UKAMHS. All competitors must have filled out a showing declaration form and paid the appropriate UKAMHS 2026 Showing Levy Fee. All horses must be nominated with UKAMHS

All exhibits must be registered with the American Miniature Horse Association (AMHA), the American Miniature Horse Registry (AMHR), or the AMHCGB Studbook (Section A/Purebred). Horses must measure appropriately for their age and cannot exceed 34 inches in height. Exhibits must have been measured at a UKAMHS approved measuring clinic or show prior to entering a qualifier.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

in the Yearling, Two Year Old, Senior Mare and Gelding and Senior Stallion Classes. All horses forward in the championship must be placed; qualification will not go lower than 6th place.

The class will be run in accordance with the UK American Miniature Horse Society, however the general rules as set out in the HOYS rulebook will take precedence, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk

Class 15a Open Private Driving Class

For horses and ponies any height, four years and over, driven to a traditional or traditional type vehicle. The vehicle may be made of modern materials but must be of a traditional profile.

Class 15b Exercise Vehicle Class

For horses and ponies any height, four years and over. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of non-traditional type design. Two or four wheeled vehicles. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability.

IRISH DRAUGHT AND IRISH DRAUGHT SPORT HORSE RIDDEN

This show is a qualifier for the £2,000 Ridden Challenge jointly sponsored by the IDHS (GB) and Yorkshire Irish Draught & Hunter Show.

The highest placed Pure Bred and Part Bred (not already qualified) from class 21 will qualify for the final. In the final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money, the Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Pure Bred Irish Draught will receive £100, and the highest placed Irish Draught Part Bred will receive £50.

Colt foals that are eligible for CBHS Grading Register Grade D, may only be shown in pure bred classes as foals. As yearlings or older they remain eligible for part-bred classes. Registration numbers must be stated on the entry form and entries will be sent to the CBHS prior to the show to confirm eligibility. **There will be NO ride judge for this class.***

Class 26 Open Ridden Cob

Mare or gelding, four years and over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms.
Rider any age. Cobs are to be shown hogged.

Class 27 Open Maxi Cob

Mare or gelding, four years and over, exceeding 155cms. Riders any age. Cobs are to be shown hogged.

Champion First and second prize winners from classes 24-27 to compete in the section championship. Champion to progress to the Ridden Supreme at the end of the show.

Class 28 Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2027

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an **Amateur**. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration. The Judge will not ride in the qualifiers but will ride in the Final. Competitors/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting, June 2027

The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships in August 2027. Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same date – August 2027

Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as an amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as a brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage(d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2025. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

BSHA LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW QUALIFIERS

Competitors and horses must hold a minimum of LIHS Qualifier-Eligible Membership/Horse Registration with the Association to be eligible to compete in the LIHS BSHA Showing series. Any competitor who qualifies for a LIHS Showing Series Supreme Final, must then complete full LIHS

qualified registration within 14 days of qualification for their qualification to stand, or it will pass to the next eligible exhibit (the nominal cost of Qualifier-Eligible membership will then be taken of the full cost of LIHS registration). Any competitors/horses which have existing BSHA membership/registration for 2026 will not be required to complete any LIHS Membership/Registration for these classes.

Classes 29-31 qualify for the LIHS BSHA Showing Series Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show, highest placed unqualified in the top five to qualify.

A results points table will run for all qualifying classes, and a 'wild card' will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier.

The judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes or at the Finals.

- walk, trot and canter on both reins.
- halt in the middle of the show/display for 4 secs before proceeding.
- a canter change of rein across the diagonal through trot or walk (5 strides max).
- lengthened canter strides.
- free walk on a long rein.

The highest unqualified horse placed in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Open Style & Performance Over 25 Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE FULL LIHS QUALIFIED MEMBERSHIP & HORSE REGISTRATION IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION. Please note LIHS

Qualifier-Eligible membership must be in place before entering any BSHA LIHS qualifying class. In addition, the two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Associate Open Style & Performance Final at the BSHA National Championships Show in September. Class 30 BSHA Open Style and Performance Series, Young Rider 15-25 years

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm. Open to ALL types, riders aged 15-25 years (Riders will be eligible from the date of their 15th birthday. Riders aged 25 yrs on 1st January 2026 will be eligible for this class). This is a flat class to be judged solely on performance; there will be no conformation marks awarded, and exhibits will not be stripped.

The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Open Style & Performance Young Rider Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE FULL LIHS QUALIFIED MEMBERSHIP & HORSE REGISTRATION IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION. *Please note LIHS Qualifier-Eligible membership must be in place before entering any BSHA LIHS qualifying class. In addition, the two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Associate Open Style & Performance Final at the BSHA National Championships Show in September. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

IRISH DRAUGHT AND IRISH DRAUGHT SPORT HORSE IN HAND

This show is affiliated to the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) and as such any horses competing in classes 43-45 must be eligible under the following criteria:

- *All horses must be registered with or over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct ownership*
- *Owners of pure-bred Irish Draughts and Irish Draught Sport Horses (Part Bred) must be full members of the IDHS (GB) to compete.*
- *Irish Draught Sport Horses/Part Bred are horses that have a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding.*
- *In hand breeding classes*
 - *Mares with foals at foot, 3 years and over must be inspected and classified as Class 1 (or RID), Class 2 or Supplementary Grade Up (or AID)*
 - *Youngstock must be the progeny of a Graded Mare (Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID, or Supplementary Grade Up Register) and be by a Class 1, Class 2 or RID (GB) stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register.*
 - *Pure bred ID and ID Sport Horse/Part Bred three years old colts must be un-inspected.*
 - *All Class 1, 2 and 3 year old colts must be bitted and shown by experienced handlers over 18 years of age.*
- *All pure-bred Irish Draught stallions:*
 - *Must be inspected and over-stamped by the IDHS (GB) and be a Class 1, 2 or RID (GB)*
 - *Stallions must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails and be shown by experienced riders/handlers over 18 years of age.*
- *Ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over.*

General Qualifier Information

- *The finals of the IDHS (GB) qualifiers will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championships on the 5th & 6th September 2026 at Pickering Grange Equestrian, Pickering Grange Farm, Ellistown, Terrance Road, Coalville, LE67 1EZ*
- *All owners of qualified horses will be contacted by a member of the IDHS (GB) Show Affiliation Team*
- *Horses can only qualify for a specific final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered.*
